Being our first time at the track we tried different pressures starting out but ended up running 29-30psi cold and reading 34-35psi hot. We tried lower pressures earlier but they didn't feel good to me so that's what we went with. The track definitely seemed to get slicker from Friday to Sat/Sun so my times progressively fell off each day.

I'm sure those that run at Sonoma regularly have a better handle on setup but wondering what you guys came up with in general that felt the best for you.
