The only vacuum lines you need are to the fuel pressure regulator and fuel pressure damper that are on the injector rail. There is a manifold vacuum port near the throttle body on the manifold. Ashort piece of vacuum line to a tee and then to both the FPR and FPD is all it takes.

Do I just disconnect the control valve? Looks like it had 2 connections for vacuum. (Dumb Question, figured it out).

I have the fuel rail vacuum connected to the back side of the throttle body. Will this be sufficient? And blocked off the front.

Yes, the vacuum line at throttle body with the black zip tie is manifold vacuum and goes to the fuel pressure regulator and fuel pressure damper. The other line on throttle body is a ported vacuum and can be blocked off.
